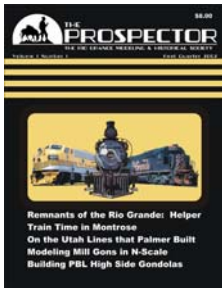

October 27, 1870 endures as a significant date in the history of Colorado, Utah and New Mexico. On that day, General William Jackson Palmer and his associates filed articles of incorporation in the Territories of Colorado and New Mexico. In the ensuing one-hundred-plus years, the story of the Denver

& Rio Grande Western takes more twists and turns than any line the road ever built over a mountain pass. It is a story of men and machines, of boxcars and boardrooms, of visionaries and pirates. Most of all it is the story of the dedicated people who built a railroad "through the Rockies, not around them." It is a fascinating story and the Rio Grande Modeling & Historical Society intends to explore it thoroughly in *The Prospector*.

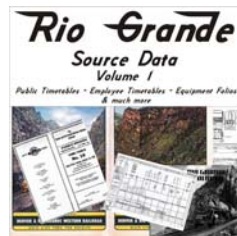

Although the Denver & Rio Grande Western Railroad is now part of the vast Union Pacific system, the road lives on through the pages of the *Green Light*. In the *Green Light* you will find news about the disposition of former Rio Grande locomotives, rolling stock and facilities. Recent issues have featured photos of former Rio Grande GP30's in a scrap yard in Wichita, Kansas, re-painted D&RGW covered hoppers in Kansas City and freshly painted 4-bay hoppers on the Kansas Pacific in Colorado.

Products of interest to fans of the Rio Grande are covered. New videos such as *Machines of Iron's Gunnison* are reviewed as are other products including Overland's N-Scale SD40T-2's, McMillan Publications' 2002 Rio Grande Color Calendar, and Morning Sun's *The Rio Grande in Color - Volume 3* by James Sandrin.

The *Green Light* also highlights Society initiatives like the *Rio Grande Source Data* project. The objective of this project is to provide an affordable way for individuals interested in the D&RGW to learn about the railroad. Original Rio Grande publications such as public timetables, employee timetables, equipment folios and other material, are scanned and stored on CD ROM. *Rio Grande Source Data Volume 1* contains over 700 pages of information from the 1890's to the 1970's.



The Rio Grande Modeling & Historical Society also maintains a web site for fans of the D&RGW. The site contains complete steam and diesel locomotive rosters, as well as rosters of freight and passenger equipment, both standard and narrow gauge.
